1. Executive Summary

This report outlines the communication and dissemination activities undertaken during the entire length of the Adaptation AGORA project (January 2023 - December 2025). The communication and dissemination strategy, co-led by APRE and CMCC under Work Package 6 (WP6), was designed to enhance project visibility, engage diverse relevant stakeholders, and promote the uptake of project knowledge. The success and ultimate impact of the Adaptation AGORA project was based on robust and extensive communication and dissemination activities.

These tasks were enhanced by the dynamic and diverse participation of the consortium across a broad spectrum of public events, including international conferences (such as COP30 in Brazil and Adaptation Futures in New Zealand), symposia, webinars, workshops, and targeted media appearances such as interviews, TV shows, and radio episodes. Particularly, two of the webinars from this project were co-organized with the European Union (EU) Mission for Adaptation to Climate Change (MIP4Adapt), given that the topics covered were of great interest to the regions and stakeholders the Mission directly interacts with.

This multifaceted approach was vital for ensuring that the project's knowledge and co-developed solutions were not confined to academic or policy silos. The strategy emphasized leveraging the strong local networks established within the project's pilot regions. This hyper-local focus enabled the project to reach specific, often marginalized, target groups, such as vulnerable citizens, and local communities who frequently did not get involved in, or even know about, complex Horizon Europe initiatives. By actively meeting communities where they were, Adaptation AGORA democratized access to climate adaptation knowledge, maximizing its relevance and societal reach.

The effective implementation of this participation strategy was strongly supported by a suite of dedicated communication assets and tools. Central to these efforts was the establishment of the project website, which served as the primary repository for all outcomes and deliverables. This digital platform was complemented by several other digital tools, ensuring wide accessibility of information. A comprehensive visual identity was a mandatory component of managing such a complex multi-partner project; maintaining this consistent identity helped project stakeholders and the wider public clearly identify and attribute Adaptation AGORA outcomes.

The results from the project were showcased on the website but also strategically spread across other relevant platforms and websites, notably the microsite Agora Community Hub (ACH), hosted by the WeADAPT knowledge platform, and the Adaptation AGORA digital handbook “Voices of Climate Adaptation”, hosted by the Dataclime platform. Additionally, links to the two digital academies as well as the mobile App were included in the project website and information regarding their launch and updates were shared through Adaptation AGORA’s social media channels, partners’



official sites and social media channels, and in joint webinars and meetings with the key target audiences, following the communication plan.

To amplify outreach and keep our stakeholders informed of the progress of our project, the Communication and Dissemination (C&D) strategic plan included maintaining a strong presence across social media channels, including a dedicated YouTube channel. This channel has proved invaluable for hosting recordings of relevant project events such as webinars and workshops, extending their lifespan and availability far beyond the initial live date. Furthermore, to reinforce the project's presence at all physical events, standardized visual materials such as cards, roll-ups, and other branding elements were consistently carried and displayed. This ensured that, regardless of the venue or context, it was always made explicitly clear that Adaptation AGORA was actively present, reinforcing the shared visual identity across all communication touchpoints.

In conclusion, Adaptation AGORA's C&D activities have laid a solid foundation toward achieving its strategic objectives. The project has successfully mobilized stakeholders and amplified its visibility in the sector. In addition, it has created a solid structure to ensure the project will continue to live in its Information and Communication (ICT) tools, open-source scientific databases, as well as the policy whitepaper.

2. Introduction

The aim of the Adaptation AGORA project is to empower national and local stakeholders across Europe by equipping them with the necessary tools and knowledge to address the impacts of climate change. The project is designed to develop and support climate adaptation strategies and multi-level dialogue, collaboration and cooperation. Adaptation AGORA was built to actively support the EU Mission on Adaptation to Climate Change. It acts as a facilitator, promoting the establishment of networks among experts, policymakers, and local communities focusing on adaptation solutions.

The Adaptation AGORA C&D strategy (D6.1), briefly described in chapter 3, was created and implemented based on the idea that the involvement of all stakeholders enriches and strengthens climate adaptation policies across the European area. The project's initial C&D strategic plan comprises the project vision, objectives, Key Performance Indicators (KPIs), tools, channels, and specific activities to be carried out with an exploitation plan to reach and engage the relevant target audiences. Throughout its three-year duration, the Adaptation AGORA project successfully expanded its target audience well beyond conventional stakeholder groups, demonstrating a clear commitment to deeply inclusive climate adaptation.

The project dedicated substantial attention to reaching as many groups as possible, with a focused effort on vulnerable groups often overlooked in EU-funded research. This deliberate inclusion



strategy encompassed various communities directly impacted by climate change vulnerabilities, including for example immigrants, elderly people, and people with disabilities. Most uniquely, Adaptation AGORA succeeded in extending its engagement to include people under custodial sentence. This exceptional activity took place specifically within the Penitentiary of Santa Maria di Capua Vetere in Italy, offering a groundbreaking opportunity to involve a highly marginalized group in climate resilience dialogue and co-creation processes.

By actively engaging these diverse and vulnerable segments of society, Adaptation AGORA ensured that its knowledge and adaptation strategies were not only broad but also deeply reflective of the varied needs and perspectives within the pilot communities.

3. Communication and dissemination strategy in brief

The Adaptation AGORA C&D strategic plan, the deliverable (D) officially titled ‘Dissemination and Communication Plan’ (D6.1) established a robust, multi-channel strategy aimed at maximizing the awareness and long-term uptake of the project’s outputs, guided by the central claim of "*Just and inclusive climate adaptation*". The strategy was defined by rigorously identifying whom, what, why, how, where, and when to disseminate information, ensuring all efforts aligned with the project's progress and goals. The project deliberately expanded its reach beyond academic circles by targeting eight distinct audience groups.

These included local communities, civil society organizations, and general public opinion, seeking to engage citizens actively from design to implementation. Concurrently, attention was dedicated to engaging *Governments and Decision-Makers* to ensure policy alignment, *Investors* to enhance business sector awareness, and the *Media* to amplify public visibility. The communication style adopted an institutional and scientific, yet simple and friendly, tone, prioritizing the use of concise, full sentences and inclusive language to effectively deliver science-based messages and counteract climate change disinformation. Dissemination relied on a suite of complementary digital and in-person tools. Table 1 showcases the different target audiences and the accompanying communication activity that was used to engage each audience type.

The project website served as the central hub for all information and activities. This was supported by the ACH, a weADAPT microsite designed to provide a long-lived home for project outputs and facilitate stakeholder networking beyond the project's duration. Core digital deliverables included two Digital Academies (focused on climate data/risk and tackling disinformation), an interactive Digital Handbook, and a mobile app, ensuring knowledge remained accessible.



Outreach efforts were amplified via official social media channels, including LinkedIn, Twitter, Facebook, and YouTube, with a goal of achieving over 1,000 total followers and 10 posts per month across platforms. Physical participation was critical, with plans for organizing webinars and peer-learning workshops, publishing at least five papers in scientific journals, issuing a minimum of five press releases, and participating in over 20 external events to ensure direct engagement with target groups.

Throughout the implementation, the project significantly exceeded the initial targets: the growth and activity across social media channels went well beyond the GA commitments, the number of scientific publications surpassed the planned objective, and the volume of in-person peer-learning workshops and external events was also higher than anticipated. This strong overperformance confirms the effectiveness of the project's communication approach in reaching diverse audiences and sustaining engagement over time. It additionally strengthened the links with stakeholders, other climate change adaptation projects at regional, national and supranational levels, contributing to guaranteeing the success of all the tasks.

Following the deployment of the initial communication plan during the first six months of the project, the day-to-day interest from the various targeted audiences shaped the communication flow with each of them. Because of this, the activities where input from citizens would contribute to research, co-creation, design and innovation of solutions, such as the ICTs, introduced various feedback loops with the key stakeholders, from decision-makers to average citizens. Lastly, both the communication activities and the digital tools were integrated into an ex-ante and ex-post exploitation strategy (described in detail in D6.5), which was set up to guarantee the project's sustainability and enduring impact after the conclusion of the grant period.

4. Communication activities

The following paragraphs provide a detailed report of the activities performed through the project's various tools and channels. The communication efforts undertaken were a collaborative success between the entire consortia, as all partners were directly involved in WP6, contributing to content creation for communication materials, for the project website, and for the social media accounts. This allowed to share the information more accurately, using local language, directly addressing the targeted audiences. Led by CMCC and APRE, partners were responsible for sharing relevant news and events, and for regularly amplifying the project's content within their respective networks. The specific actions carried out during this period are detailed below, highlighting key milestones, progress, and preliminary outcomes.

Throughout the project lifecycle, the communication plan and associated activities were continuously adjusted and adapted to maximize outreach and relevance. This strategic flexibility was governed by an ongoing assessment of stakeholder needs, preferences, and highly trafficked



fora, ensuring that the project's dissemination efforts were always targeted and impactful. The deliberate integration and utilization of established external platforms, such as MIP4Adapt/Futurium, Horizon Results Platform, and Zenodo, significantly boosted the project's visibility and facilitated wide knowledge transfer to relevant policy and research communities.

4.1 Internal monthly meetings

To ensure consistent and aligned implementation of communication activities, monthly internal coordination meetings have been held since the start of the project. While the monthly meetings were dedicated to the whole consortium, bilateral meetings were also held in support of specific activities. These meetings serve as a structured forum for:

- Reviewing progress on ongoing communication tasks, including social media planning, website updates, and content production;
- Identifying opportunities and challenges and share news and ideas;
- Aligning priorities, ensuring that responsibilities were distributed according to designated efforts and deadlines are met.

4.2 Development of visual communication materials

To ensure consistent branding across all project outputs, a comprehensive visual communication toolkit was developed. This resource was updated following the project's formal name change (from AGORA to Adaptation AGORA) and provides all necessary design elements and guidelines for project partners. Materials were always made available on the project's SharePoint, and they include:

- Project logo;
- Claim;
- Deliverable template;
- Power Point presentation template;
- Events participation certificate template;
- Letterhead template;
- Rollup;
- Promotional card;
- Virtual background for calls;
- Background for surveys;
- Social media covers;
- Social media cards;
- Glossary of Adaptation AGORA terminology;
- Communication kit (ppt presentations of the main project achievements).

4.3 Social media accounts

The digital communication strategy focused on building a strong online presence for Adaptation AGORA to engage a wide range of stakeholders and amplify project results.

Three main social channels have been systematically used to ensure broad reach and targeted engagement:

- [LinkedIn](#): serves as the primary engine for scientific and professional dissemination. Its users primarily consist of policymakers, climate adaptation experts, academics, and industry professionals. The account was opened in February 2023 (made publicly available on March 1st).
- [Facebook](#): dedicated to a slightly different public. Its user base is a wider, non-specialist audience that is mobilized by the project's societal relevance, local success stories, and direct calls for participation in the project activities. The account was opened in February 2023 (made publicly available on March 1st).
- [YouTube](#): functions as the main repository for video content. This includes publishing recordings of project webinars, interviews and promotional clips thereby enhancing accessibility and knowledge transfer across the project's duration. The account was opened in December 2023.

Status of [X](#) (Formerly Twitter)

The account was initially opened in February 2023, and the content was publicly launched on March 1, 2023. However, sharing was formally stopped in December 2024, following an internal review, due to its insufficient content moderation and facts check, and for reported data privacy violations under the GDPR (General Data Protection Regulation) regarding its data collection practices for AI training. While the profile remains active (not deleted), the project has ceased all activity on the platform. Resources initially allocated to X were redirected to boost activity on LinkedIn, Facebook, and YouTube. Here below a brief of the social media KPIs until Month (M) 35.

As visible from the shared statistics, the social media channels KPIs greatly exceeded the targets set in the Grant Agreement (GA) (>1000 followers in total). This excellent outcome is a direct consequence of the strategic decision to significantly boost the volume of shared posts. This approach often led to the monthly output almost doubling the GA target of 20 posts across the three social media channels. Beyond the quantitative success demonstrated by the social media KPIs, the qualitative approach to communication, particularly concerning language, was critical.

Language inclusion was a crucial element in Adaptation AGORA's communication strategy, ensuring respectful, equitable, and widespread participation of diverse citizens. To achieve this, the project utilized a total of five different languages in its activities. Materials and activities linked to the Pilot regions (Rome, Zaragoza, Malmö, Dresden) were consistently made available in English and the respective local language (Italian, Spanish, Swedish, and German) with the help and contribution from all partners involved in those languages.

Workshops and events were often conducted in the local language to maximize participants' comprehension and facilitate exchanges. Furthermore, event promotions, updates, surveys, and reports were frequently produced in double language, always maintaining an English version. Moreover, to guarantee the broadest possible reach, the ACH included an automatic translation plugin, the same Google Translate plugin installed on the main Adaptation AGORA.

4.4 Website

The Adaptation AGORA project has established its visibility and knowledge transfer strategy around a robust digital ecosystem, starting with the official website (<https://adaptationagora.eu/>). This tool serves as the central access point to all project activities and products, supporting adherence to the EU Mission on Adaptation to Climate Change by activating a vast pan-European community. Initially deployed as a landing page at M2, the website was officially launched at M6, subsequently becoming the central pillar for the project's communication and dissemination activities. The



website is organized around five main navigational sections, which function as the primary structure for communication and dissemination, which are:

About

- **Project Overview:** provides the high-level goals, approach (multidisciplinary, integrated), and the overall mission (just and inclusive climate adaptation).
- **Consortium:** lists the partner organizations involved in the project.
- **Followers:** details the regions, associations, and institutions that have joined the project to benefit from and contribute to the community beyond the core pilots.
- **Ethical Board:** provides information about the project's ethics and governance body.

Digital Tools

- [Agora Community Hub](#): the *living digital environment* for networking, communication, and peer finding among stakeholders, experts, and citizens.
- [Digital Academies](#): two specific academies focusing on (1) accessing and using open-source climate data and (2) addressing climate change disinformation.
- [Digital Handbook](#): an interactive multimedia platform intended to be the final product for knowledge integration and collecting *lessons learned*.
- **Mobile APP:** A gamified application used to support citizen education and increase engagement in climate change adaptation. The “AGORA Quiz” app is available for both [Android](#) and [iOS](#).

Outputs

This section serves as the repository for the project’s official results, reports, and deliverables and it is divided into the following repositories:

- **Reports/Guidelines:** Contains interim reports and protocols related to initial research, reviews, and methodologies.
- **Events with citizens, stakeholders and decision-makers:** Lists reports and protocols detailing co-creation workshops and project participation in external events.
- **Deliverables:** Lists deliverables from various Work Packages, focusing on strategy, methodologies, and technical documentation.
- **Published Papers:** Lists publications and conference presentations related to the project.
- **Newsletters:** A chronological list of the project's official newsletters.
- **Adaptation AGORA Modules:** Lists various learning modules focused on climate change adaptation, disinformation, and media literacy.
- **Visual Materials:** Includes various promotional materials.
- **Videos:** Lists video content, primarily from the Digital Academy.

News & Events

- News: updates, announcements, and articles related to project progress and climate adaptation topics (e.g., event summaries, publication mentions).
- Events: information and schedules for upcoming webinars, workshops, and project meetings.

Contacts

- Provides the project coordinator's details (CMCC) and official email address.
- Includes links to the project's main social media channels (Facebook, LinkedIn and YouTube).

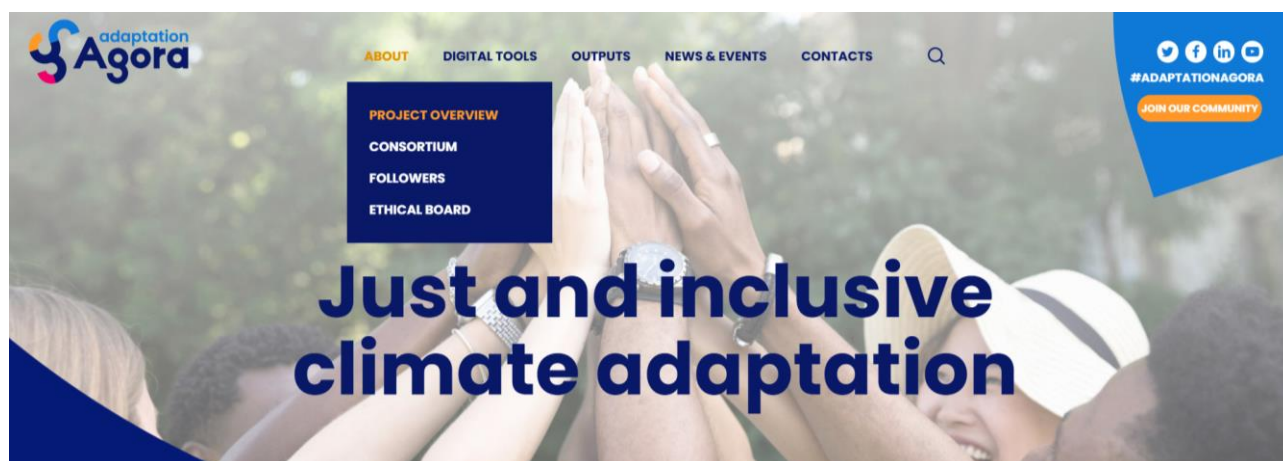


Figure 2. Website homepage.

To proactively facilitate engagement and eliminate language barriers for our diverse European audience, the Adaptation AGORA website incorporates the Google Translate plugin. This functionality allows users to instantly translate the website content into numerous languages, ensuring that crucial project information, technical results, and calls for participation are readily accessible to all stakeholders and citizens, regardless of their native language. This strategic implementation supports the project's goal of broad and inclusive participation across different regions.

Web analytics

To effectively monitor user interaction and guide continuous site improvements, MATOMO analytics software was installed on the website. This implementation allows us to measure audience engagement, track user journeys, and gather vital metrics to refine the user experience and optimize content dissemination.

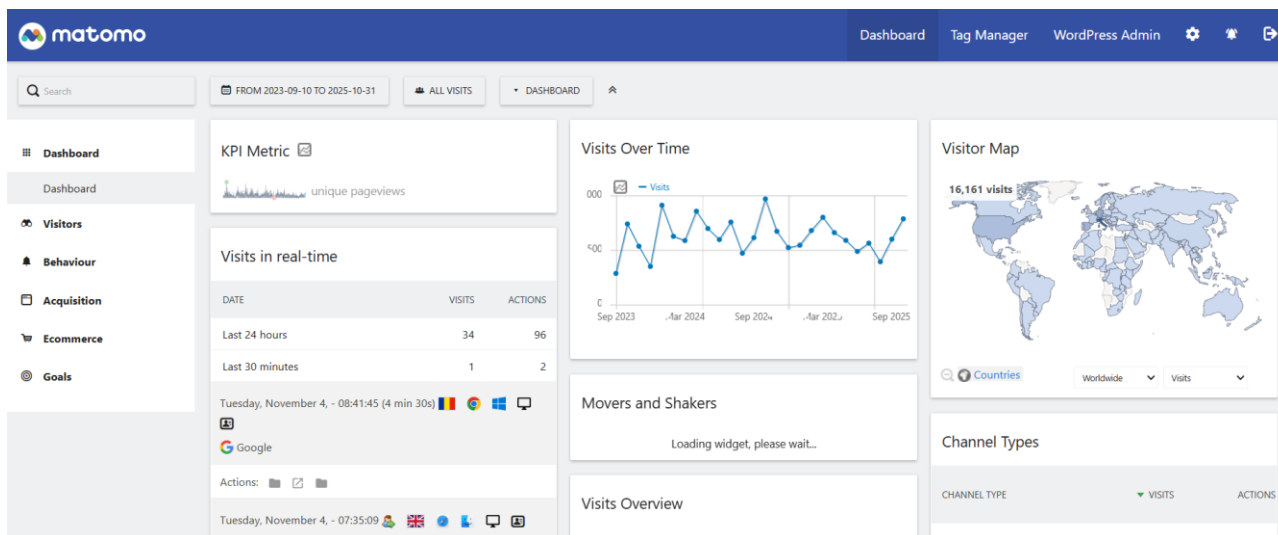


Figure 3. Example of the Matomo web analytics tool dashboard of the Adaptation AGORA project.

The website has proven to be a highly effective communication and dissemination platform, achieving exceptional global reach and demonstrating consistently increasing engagement since its launch. This steady upward trend indicates that the communication strategy resonated with target audiences, continuously drawing new users and retaining engagement over time. This metric highlights the value of the platform as a central information hub and knowledge repository for the project. A particularly significant achievement is the website’s visitors spanning from China or Australia to the United States. The project successfully engaged not only the core EU community but also drew substantial traffic from countries spanning the globe.

This powerful international engagement confirms that the challenges and innovative solutions presented by Adaptation AGORA have relevance far beyond the European context. This global resonance is a major success, demonstrating that the project’s findings and approach to climate adaptation and citizen engagement can inspire and inform communities all across the globe. The website promised KPIs (>10000 total number of visits) were substantially exceed. See table 3 below.

Inclusive climate adaptation in Aragón

On May 29th, a participatory workshop was held in Zaragoza within the Aragón pilot, in collaboration with Fundación ASPACE. This inclusive session centered the voices and experiences of individuals with cerebral palsy, addressing how climate change—particularly extreme heat—impacts people with disabilities. Participants shared personal stories, identified systemic barriers in urban mobility and access to cooling infrastructures, and proposed practical adaptation strategies. The event not only highlighted the urgency of integrating diverse needs into climate resilience planning but also emphasized the community's strong desire for meaningful participation in adaptation efforts. This initiative exemplifies Adaptation AGORA's commitment to fostering inclusive, citizen-led responses to the climate crisis.

All the newsletters are available for download on the Adaptation AGORA website, under “outputs”.

The project’s newsletter mailing list has grown steadily to 278 subscribers (at M35) which do not include our followers, as a special channel was devised to communicate with this group of stakeholders. This dedicated readership demonstrates strong interest in Adaptation AGORA’s activities, which is further validated by a consistently high open rate of 60% (at M35). This key metric confirms that the content strategy successfully resonates with our target audience.

All the newsletters have been produced in collaboration with the consortium partners and have been disseminated using MailUp.

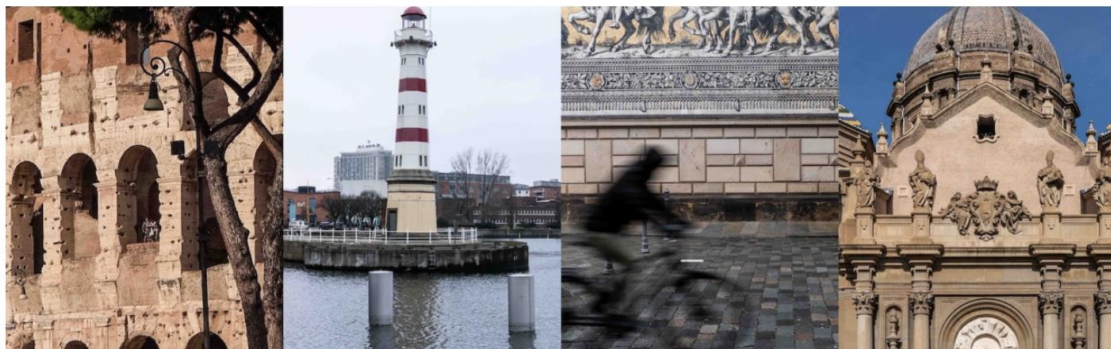
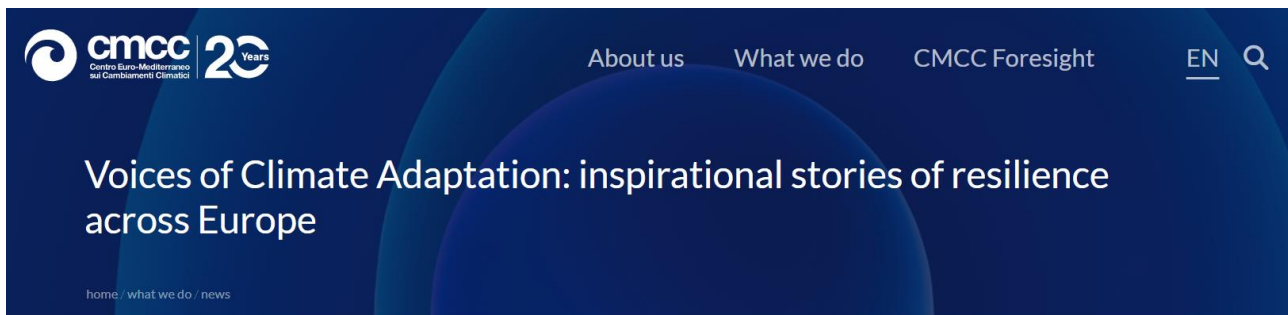


Figure 5. Example of press release.

4.8 Partners contribution to the communication activities

The successful execution of communication activities was significantly bolstered by the active engagement of the entire consortium. Partners heavily contributed to the task by systematically amplifying project information across their own networks. This comprehensive effort included sharing news and updates on their official institutional websites and social media channels, distributing content through their organizational newsletters, and leveraging personal and professional networks.

Considering the applicability of the citizen-engagement methodologies developed within the project, the ICTs, the policy analysis and other key elements of the project, partners were able to implement the projects’ outcomes outside the specific activities of Adaptation AGORA. This widespread, decentralized dissemination approach ensured that Adaptation AGORA’s visibility and reach were substantially maximized, effectively contributing to the overall success of the communication work package.

To accurately monitor and attribute the consortium’s extensive communication efforts, Adaptation AGORA organized designated filing systems to collect all communication activities conducted by the partners (e.g., website postings, social media shares, newsletter contributions). Detailed specifications regarding who performed which communication task and when are formally documented and made available on the European Commission Funding & Tenders Portal.



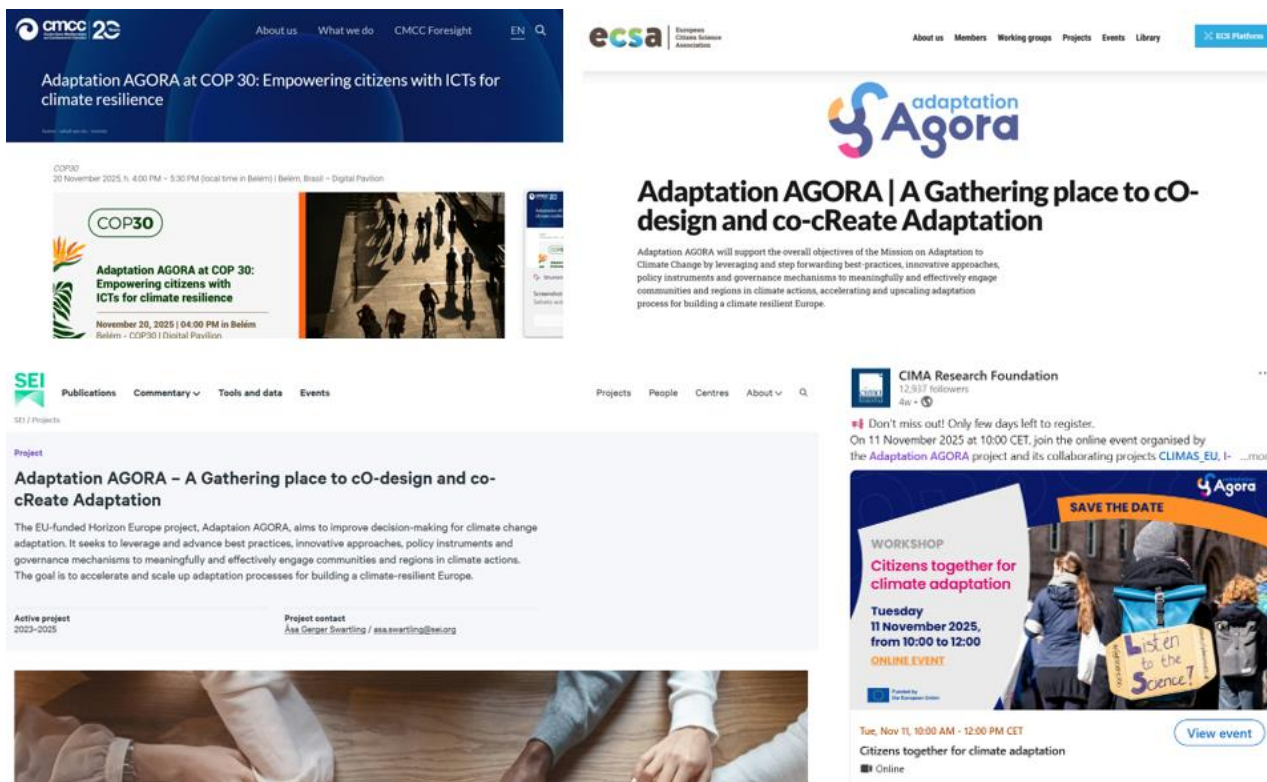
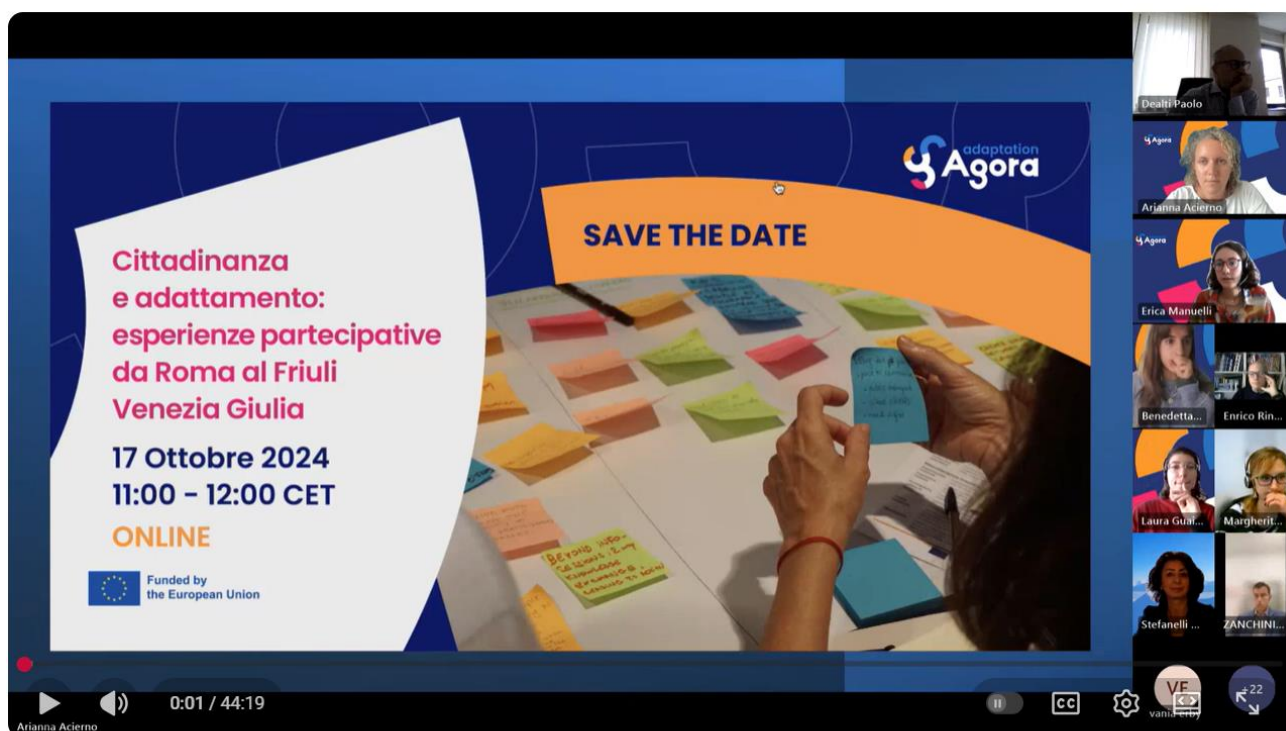


Figure 6. Example of communication activities carried out by the consortium on the web.

4.9 Communication with the Adaptation AGORA followers

A high level of communication was maintained with the dedicated Adaptation AGORA Followers. These Followers (for a total of 28 entities, within which 3 are located outside the pilot regions), comprising other regions, associations, organizations, and institutions actively involved in climate adaptation, represent a crucial extension of the project's community. The four pilot cities driving the project's core activities were Rome (Italy), Malmö (Sweden), Dresden (Germany), and Zaragoza (Spain).

While 25 Followers are geographically associated with these pilot countries, the three entities expanding the network internationally included the City of Almada (Portugal), University College Dublin (Ireland), and the City of Luckau (Germany). To ensure consistent and tailored outreach, a dedicated mailing list served as the core channel for direct communication. Followers were contacted with a frequency of about one contact every two months, either through the project newsletter or via targeted invitations to specific activities. For instance, this personalized approach resulted in the participation of the Friuli Venezia Giulia region (Adaptation AGORA Follower of the Italian pilot) in the online workshop, "[Cittadinanza e adattamento: esperienze partecipative da Roma al Friuli Venezia Giulia](#)" (Citizenship and adaptation: participatory experiences from Rome to Friuli Venezia Giulia), which highlighted their experience alongside the Italian pilot city of Rome.

A dedicated page was also established on the institutional website of Adaptation AGORA, specifically designed to give visibility to these entities and stimulate the interest of other organizations in becoming Followers. This proactive approach maximized the project's reach and ensured that the diverse needs and requests of the extended European community were continually addressed.

Followers have been mostly contacted to: 1) share event invitations; 2) promote the Adaptation AGORA digital tools; 3) share relevant project updates; 3) offer support within the field of climate adaptation initiatives; 4) test the beta version of the mobile app. Crucially, the Follower network includes representatives who are themselves key regional decision-makers involved in climate governance. Direct engagement with these individuals represents a significant exploitation multiplier for the project's policy-relevant outputs, particularly the Policy White Paper, one of the final project results.

By facilitating the transfer of Adaptation AGORA co-creation methods and policy recommendations directly to actors with the mandate to implement change, this targeted dissemination pathway accelerates the adoption of resilient strategies, making a stronger contribution to the needed societal and institutional transformation across Europe.

In annex A of this document, a detailed list of the communication (and dissemination) activities is outlined, identifying the means of communication, target audience and in the case of publicly available register, links to the event or activity. These also include discussion forums and initiatives organized by other projects or entities where Adaptation AGORA was invited to participate, expanding the outreach, networking and contributing to increase the number of followers throughout the project. It served as a two-way communication between the project and stakeholder groups including decision makers.

5. Dissemination activities

This chapter details how the specific knowledge, methodologies, and results generated by Adaptation AGORA were strategically transferred to the target groups that can implement or build upon them. Focused on maximizing the project's scientific and practical utility, this section covers key knowledge-transfer actions, including the organization of dedicated webinars and workshops, academic publications (peer-reviewed), participation in scientific conferences, and engagement in other dissemination activities.

These activities demonstrate the project's success in ensuring its new knowledge is accessible and usable, enabling fellow researchers, policymakers, and practitioners to uptake and replicate key project outputs for subsequent research and innovation efforts. In Table 5 a summary of the target audiences involved in the Adaptation AGORA project are outlined together with the dissemination activity type that was identified as the most appropriate according to the characteristics of the target audiences. A full list of the dissemination activities can be found in Annex A.

It should be noted that Adaptation AGORA gained interest of stakeholder groups that were included in some of the target audiences but were not under the initial scope of the communication and dissemination activities. This is the case for instance of members of the local community with cerebral palsy in Zaragoza, the Spanish Pilot, who directly contacted the members of the Adaptation AGORA team showing their interest in the project.

Similarly, other stakeholder groups who were not an initial part of the Adaptation AGORA audience also knew about the project and wanted to participate proactively in activities as well as know the development of the project and its results. This was the case for instance of mental health workers and prisoners in the case of the Italian Pilot. Considering how climate change adaptation plans and strategies should provide solutions to all stakeholders, being able to incorporate these target audiences was key. Therefore, additional efforts were carried out by the Pilot leaders to create specific communication and dissemination activities with these stakeholders, which are outlined in Annex A.

5.1 Webinars

The project heavily relied on a structured series of webinars to achieve its core goals of co-creation and knowledge dissemination. These events moved beyond simple information sharing, serving as critical platforms for direct stakeholder engagement and dialogue. A strategic of webinars were employed to transfer specialized knowledge and bridge the science-practice gap. These highly targeted events covered critical themes like climate change adaptation, energy poverty, urban heat vulnerability, and tackling disinformation. By hosting peer-to-peer exchanges and specialized technical, the project effectively ensured that expert insights and learned lessons were immediately accessible to practitioners and policymakers across Europe.

5.2 In-person activities

Engaging with stakeholders in climate-adaptation frameworks requires in-person activities, as they are a vital part of the engagement strategy. While webinars and workshops carried out online were highly valuable and allow the project to reach a larger number of participants, with certain topics and specific groups it was deemed fundamental to be able to carry out dissemination in-person. Therefore, the project included activities where the results from the project were shared directly with key stakeholders.



At the Zaragoza General Assembly in January 2024, the internal in-person activities took place to shape the specific outputs of the project that required feedback from various stakeholder groups. This was the case of the ACH, Academies and Mobile App. This initial feedback was complemented with external groups once the Beta version was completed. During 2024 when the academies and mobile App were first launched, these tools were showcased in workshops with the private sector, university students, scientists and citizen groups participating in specific activities. These workshops took place in the form of focus group activities to provide feedback.

The in-person activities also served as a platform to share progress and partial results as well as obtaining feedback from stakeholders. For example, the positive deviations that resulted in in-person activities with prisoners, senior citizens or diversely abled citizens, allowed to receive feedback from cohorts that would have otherwise not been able to be reached in online formats.

In doing so, the Adaptation AGORA project ensured that the online C&D efforts were adequately complemented with in-person activities, catering to the needs of each stakeholder groups and ensuring maximum diffusion. This was also the case when certain types of target audiences were identified as not being easily reached through online platforms or being firstly necessary to partake in certain in-person activities. Because of this, participating in in-person events whenever possible was also prioritized, such as attending the Adaptation Futures 2023 conference in Canada and the 2025 in New Zealand.

Thanks to these in-person events, the dissemination of the work carried out in Adaptation AGORA was expanded to include target audiences outside of the initial scope of the project. As the execution of the project continued, and the results were shared by different stakeholders, the project gained interest from key groups that valued significantly the impact the citizen engagement methodologies, results from Pilots, ICTs and policy analysis were gaining. Hence, the dissemination strategy continued supporting in-person events that specifically targeted key audiences that may not be directly linked to the Pilots or followers.

The project was invited to present at the [European Space Agency Living Planet Symposium](#) during June 2025. In this in-person event, leaders of citizen science groups and decision-makers, as well as experts in earth sciences and earth modelling from all over Europe and the world attended the session. Similarly, Adaptation AGORA was also invited to present at COP 30 in two sessions, firstly in the Digital Pavillion showcasing the project results and the ICTs created, and secondly at the Spanish Pavillion, moderating a discussion on disinformation and misinformation in climate adaptation contexts. These in-person meetings were also crucial to the dissemination of the project results, and to achieve some of the Key Exploitable Results/Objective Key Results (KER/OKRs).



5.3 Peer-learning workshops

As a core part of the dissemination strategy (Task 6.3), Adaptation AGORA organized dedicated peer-learning workshops to encourage intensive knowledge transfer and identify collaboration opportunities with other relevant projects. Three workshops were organized, providing a vital platform for mutual learning, allowing the project to both learn from and teach existing participatory and deliberative processes. They involved both internal consortium members (to refine strategies for involving policymakers and citizens) and external stakeholders, ensuring the project's outcomes were communicated while fostering joint actions and partnerships. Some of these activities took place in online formats and others in-person, according to the needs of the stakeholder groups involved and the objectives of the workshops.

Other projects and initiatives highly contributed to the dissemination of Adaptation AGORA activities and results; this is the case of ClimateADAPT and MAIA, and of the “[Piattaforma Nazionale Cambiamenti Climatici](#)” and of MIP4Adapt. Further information is available in D6.3 (D6.3-Report on activities conducted to build on synergies). Adaptation AGORA maximized its visibility and impact through extensive collaboration with the Mission over the entire three-year duration of the project.

This partnership was instrumental, enabling Adaptation AGORA to benefit significantly from the Mission's dedicated resources and extensive outreach capabilities. Collaboration included the co-organisation of numerous events, which utilized MIP4Adapt's logistical support and wide network to reach key stakeholders and policymakers. Furthermore, MIP4Adapt actively promoted the project and its results, frequently showcasing Adaptation AGORA and its key achievements through their dedicated private communication channels, as well as in the Thematic Working Group outputs, like the Briefing Note.

This continuous engagement (1 meeting a month within the thematic working group, led by SEI OX on the Adaptation AGORA side) ensured that Adaptation AGORA remained at the forefront of the EU Mission on Adaptation to Climate Change and benefited from enhanced credibility and amplified dissemination across the European climate community.

In addition to these collaborations, as the communication and dissemination activities took place, other projects and initiatives started incorporating the results from Adaptation AGORA, as well as new project proposals being based on these. Examples include TICCA4DANU, which will be incorporating the digital tools created by Adaptation AGORA, or [SystR](#), which incorporates the citizen engagement methodologies and processes and some of the digital tools. In D6.5 a comprehensive list of these projects is outlined, to showcase how the results from this project will continue to be exploited by Horizon Europe projects and other initiatives, as well as other stakeholders.

5.3 Partners contribution to the dissemination activities

The delivery of the project’s scientific and technical results was significantly reliant on the active commitment of the entire consortium to dissemination. Partners heavily contributed by ensuring that key knowledge outputs, such as protocols, technical reports, publications, and finalized methodologies, reached their respective professional and scientific communities. This dedicated effort involved a wide and strategically targeted range of activities, including:

- Participation in scientific conferences (e.g., EGU General Assembly, ECCA, Adaptation Futures, MEDCLIVAR-SISC, etc.), where partners presented research findings, established methodologies, and introduced the Digital Academies and the ACH.



- Targeted presentations and workshops with specific end-users, such as local authorities, civil society groups, and health sector professionals, to ensure the direct uptake of knowledge related to pilot work.

Collaboration with EU-funded projects and Mission Adaptation events, maximizing the project's synergy and ensuring its results informed broader European efforts. By leveraging their established academic and professional networks through these diverse events, partners ensured that Adaptation AGORA's core outputs gained early and direct visibility among the researchers, policymakers, and practitioners best positioned to utilize the new knowledge. To accurately monitor and attribute the consortium's extensive dissemination efforts, Adaptation AGORA organized designated filing systems.

These systems were used to collect documentation regarding each partner's contribution, specifically detailing the sharing of outputs, conference attendance, and people reached. Detailed specifications regarding who performed which dissemination task and when are formally documented and made available on the European Commission Funding & Tenders Portal. Finally, the Consortium has already taken steps to ensure the lasting legacy of Adaptation AGORA by committing to post-project dissemination. One example is SEI's scheduled presentation at the Stockholm Smart City Expo in May 2026, which will ensure continued visibility of results.

Various positive deviation events stemmed from the networking reach of the project partners. These events expanded the outreach of Adaptation AGORA beyond the initial target audiences and actively engaged vulnerable groups and stakeholders who are often dismissed in adaptation spaces.

Most notably was the event within the Penitentiary of Santa Maria di Capua Vetere in Italy, involving a highly marginalized group in climate resilience dialogue and co-creation processes. Being one of the few Horizon Europe projects to engage with this unique population, this was a significant event for the project. Another positive deviation worth mentioning is the network of activities that substituted the Adaptation AGORA final event. While the initial plan anticipated a single large-scale final event intended to host over 100 people, the project strategically pivoted this approach to maximize geographical inclusion and local impact.

The single large event was replaced by numerous smaller events, workshops, and high-level presentations that were carefully spread across the EU geographical level. This decentralized strategy ensured that project results were not only presented to a wider, more diverse audience but also directly disseminated and tailored within local contexts, significantly boosting the project's overall reach and engagement with a variety of stakeholders. Furthermore, the strategy included presentations at globally significant events, raising the project's profile dramatically.



For example, as mentioned in section 5.2, at the end of the project in November 2025 Adaptation AGORA was presented at Adaptation Futures in New Zealand and, notably, at COP30 in Brazil. In both locations, the project's participation involved multiple events, including presentations, workshops, and bilateral exchanges, engaging a target audience that extended well beyond Adaptation AGORA's planned stakeholder group. This provided the project with visibility and access to unique, high-level audiences rarely reached by Horizon Europe projects.

A full list of events, including small scale and regional meetings is available in the Annex and on the EU Commission portal.

5.5 Publications, Platforms, and Scientific Outreach

To ensure the long-term archiving and wide visibility of its scientific knowledge, Adaptation AGORA established its own dedicated [Zenodo Community](#). This repository is central to the project's adherence to Open Science principles, serving as the official, publicly accessible platform for housing all non-peer-reviewed outputs, including datasets, software, presentations, and technical reports. By publishing these records on Zenodo, the project ensures they are permanently accessible and citable (at least for ≥ 15 years). In parallel, the project significantly contributed to the academic sphere.

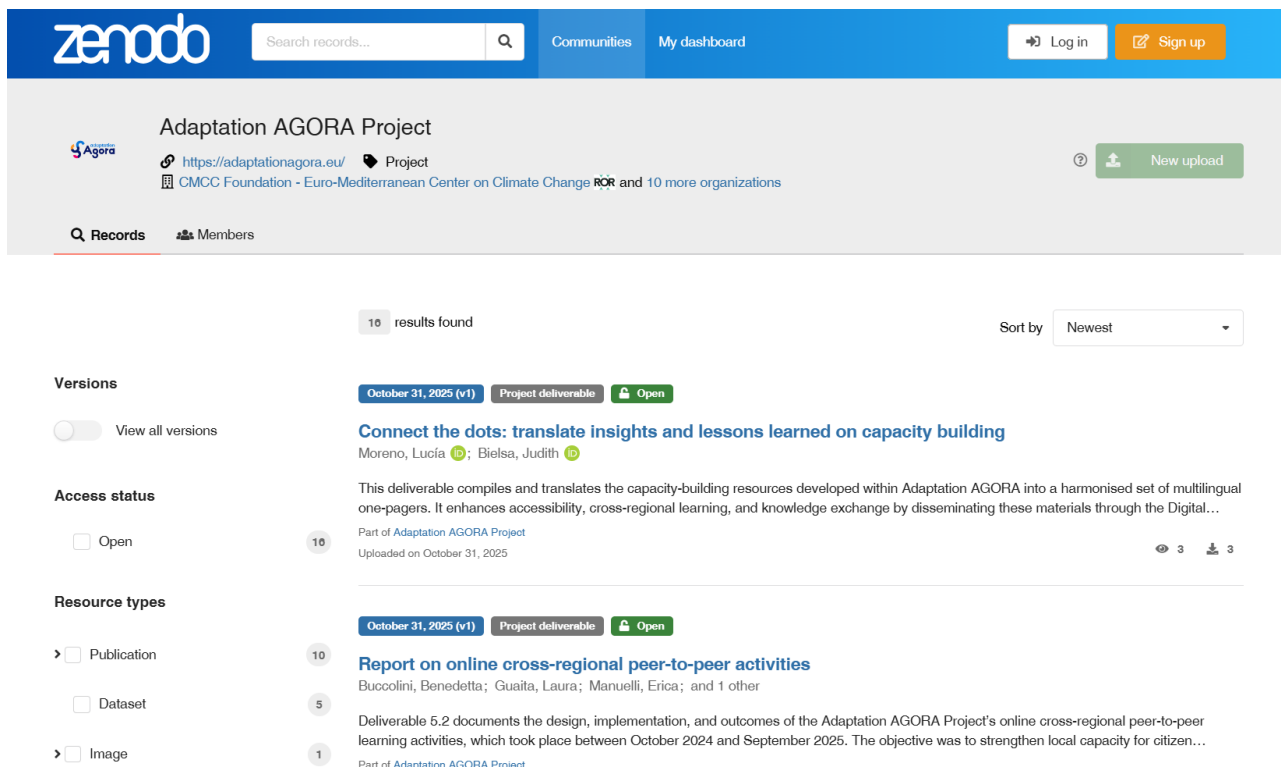


Figure 12. Adaptation AGORA Zenodo community.

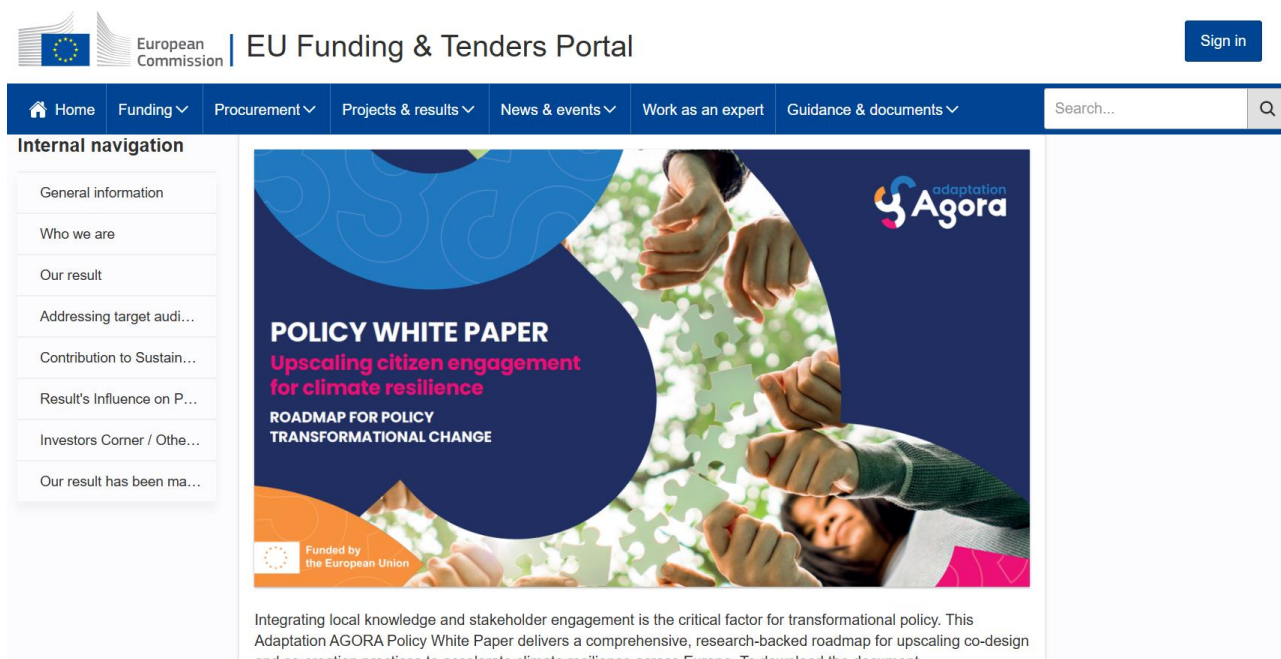


Figure 13. Policy White Paper on the Horizon Results Platform.



Complementing the articles that were created addressing the general public, 11 scientific research papers have been already published in peer-reviewed scientific journals, and several undergoing the peer-review process, expecting to see the final acceptance throughout next year to be published in 2026 and 2027. Furthermore, the Consortium maintains a robust pipeline of research currently being finalized, the derived papers planned to be submitted in the coming months, demonstrating a clear commitment to generating a lasting scientific legacy. Here below a list of the peer-reviewed publications, that as in the case of the dissemination events, exceeding the KPI (no 5) described in the GA.

In addition to the herein described scientific papers, the Adaptation AGORA project management team secured the opportunity to create a special issue in the European Journal of Education, Research, Development and Policy, a top tier (Q1) scientific publication. This created a communication and dissemination sphere for part of the project's results and it enabled to generate a space for new scientific advancements to be showcased related to the challenges faced in different aspects of education and training related to climate change adaptation and risks. Three members of CMCC's team served as guest editors for this special issue and the complete set of selected articles has already been published in 2025, many of which are open access and can be found in [the journals' dedicated section](#).

This constitutes another positive deviation from the initial objectives for communication and dissemination activities established in the Grant Agreement and initial Communication Plan (D6.1) and it further enabled links with other institutions advancing research in this knowledge area. This strategic decision from the project management team, which was launched at the end of 2023, contributed to further position the project's research within the scientific community, gaining interest from around the globe in the activities carried out and potential outcomes.




5.5 The Digital Handbook

The Digital Handbook, "[Voices of Climate Adaptation](#)," represents the project's ultimate and most enduring dissemination asset. Unlike traditional reports, this interactive, multimedia platform provides a single, dynamic point of access to the entire Adaptation AGORA legacy, ensuring the project's outputs remain usable and relevant long after its conclusion. Its primary importance for dissemination lies in its ability to integrate and contextualize complex results.


The Handbook achieves this by framing all project activities, from the four diverse pilot region studies (Italy, Germany, Sweden, Spain) to high-level findings on Science and Data, Public Awareness, and Policy in the making, as a coherent citizen engagement journey. This structure makes the lessons learned and co-created solutions immediately accessible and applicable to external communities. By serving as a user-friendly, interactive archive, the Handbook ensures the replicability of the project's innovative methodologies and promotes the scaling-up of effective policy instruments.

It is engineered to sustain the project's visibility and impact, offering a living dialogue for stakeholders and citizens seeking to understand and implement place-based climate adaptation strategies. Because of its relevance it was deemed fundamental to launch it in M34 instead of the originally scheduled M36 according to the GA. With this change, the handbook achieved the number of visits before project completion, in December 2025 the downloadable version was launched and information related to its availability will be carried out through the partner's official sites and in the events planned for 2026 it will be further disseminated.

6. Cross-cutting support and internal service provision

The Communication and Dissemination work package together with the Project Management (WP7) and ethics (WP8) work packages served as an essential internal support to the various C&D activities, interaction with the established target audiences, catering to the needs of each stakeholder, and adapting the communication channels. This was essential as the requirements evidenced through WP2 with the Pilot experiences provided an initial standing point, however as the project progressed and new stakeholders were involved, these needs changed.

This dedicated support function began with the preparation of core dissemination materials required for collaborative activities, including supporting the production of scientific posters and PowerPoint presentation, and other visual materials for all key external meetings and workshops. This support also included designing robust event registration forms and establishing secure procedures that rigorously addressed issues such as GDPR compliance and mitigating the risk of data leaks, thereby ensuring all co-creation activities were run ethically and legally. This was especially necessary after the cyberattack carried out during the first live webinar in January 2024.

Risk-management monitoring and implementation of mitigation as well as offsetting measures through the leadership of WP7 was key to enable better adjustment and the creation of specific policies and standard operating procedures to ensure stakeholder data remained safe.

Beyond material creation, communication and dissemination actively functioned as a networking broker, dedicating efforts to link relevant projects, connect individuals, and foster collaboration across different WPs and external consortia, ensuring the Adaptation AGORA network remained vibrant. This continuous function was also centralized through the info@adaptationagora.eu email account that provided a dedicated, responsive communication and dissemination service to all external and internal stakeholders approaching the project. Additional materials generated to support the dissemination of the results produced within Adaptation AGORA was the development of the graphical summary for the Policy White Paper, showcased in Figure 17.

Recognizing that the Policy White Paper (D4.4) outlines the complex Roadmap for Policy Transformational Change and targets high-level policymakers, the WP6 team ensured its core message would resonate immediately. The graphical summary was designed to distil the paper's key insights, providing a visually intuitive, easily digestible overview of the policy recommendations and the scaling framework, thereby allowing for faster and more effective comprehension and digestion of the necessary information by busy policy audiences.

1. Executive Summary

Climate change demands comprehensive adaptation strategies that are not only effective but also equitable and socially accepted. Meaningful citizen and stakeholder engagement is the cornerstone of such strategies, promising to harness local knowledge, build public trust and ensure just adaptation outcomes. However, despite strong European Union (EU) policy support and many inspiring local initiatives, engagement in climate adaptation across Europe remains fragmented, often reduced to tokenistic exercises that struggle to achieve their potential.

This Adaptation AGORA policy white paper addresses the critical gap between high-level ambition and on-the-ground implementation. It argues that to move from isolated successes to a new standard of climate governance, Europe must adopt a holistic approach to scaling engagement. This requires moving beyond replicating successful pilots (scaling out) to simultaneously impacting laws and policies (scaling up), shifting cultural values toward participation (scaling deep), and strengthening the internal capacities and means for action of the organizations responsible for implementation (scaling in and down). Without this multi-dimensional strategy that builds systemic enabling conditions, engagement practices risk reinforcing inequalities, fostering public distrust and undermining long-term adaptation goals.

To catalyse this transformation, this white paper presents a strategic roadmap developed from a comprehensive analysis of current research, policies and practices. It builds on a synthesis of evidence from academic literature, EU policy instruments, EU-level documents, participatory practices, and empirical insights from the Adaptation AGORA project. The roadmap is structured around four interconnected pillars, which collectively address the institutional, financial, cultural and practical challenges hindering the scaling of stakeholder and citizen engagement:

1. Institutionalizing engagement: Embedding citizen and stakeholder engagement as a formal, standardised component of climate adaptation governance across all levels and sectors. This includes strengthening EU leadership,

establishing clear legal mandates, mainstreaming engagement into socio-economic sectors, and embedding principles of climate justice into policy frameworks.

2. Strengthening local capacity: Empowering local authorities, as the primary actors involved in adaptation, with the dedicated funding, robust internal structures, targeted training and sustained political commitment necessary to design and implement high-quality and effective engagement processes.

3. Empowering citizens and stakeholders: Ensuring all members of society, particularly vulnerable and marginalized groups, have the awareness, opportunity, and capacity to participate meaningfully. This involves enhancing climate literacy, removing practical barriers to participation, and actively supporting community-led adaptation and citizen action initiatives.

4. Sharing and applying knowledge and best practices: Fostering a culture of continuous learning and improvement by strengthening knowledge exchange platforms, facilitating

cross-cultural dialogue, promoting the use of diverse and context-tailored methodologies and ensuring transparency through robust feedback and evaluation mechanisms.

This roadmap provides 16 actionable policy and governance recommendations for European, national, regional and local actors. These recommendations are grounded in the Adaptation AGORA project's theoretical and practical insights from systematic analysis of engagement contexts and pilot activities, ensuring they are both evidence-based and relevant to real-world challenges. Pillars and recommendations were refined and validated through interaction with the target audience during several major European events (Grenoble Biennale of Cities in Transition 2025, European Climate Change Adaptation Conference 2025, European Urban Resilience Forum 2025).

The roadmap is not intended to be a one-size-fits-all blueprint framework. It provides a flexible guidance and directions to support policymakers and practitioners, and to empower civil society to collectively build a climate resilient and democratic Europe.

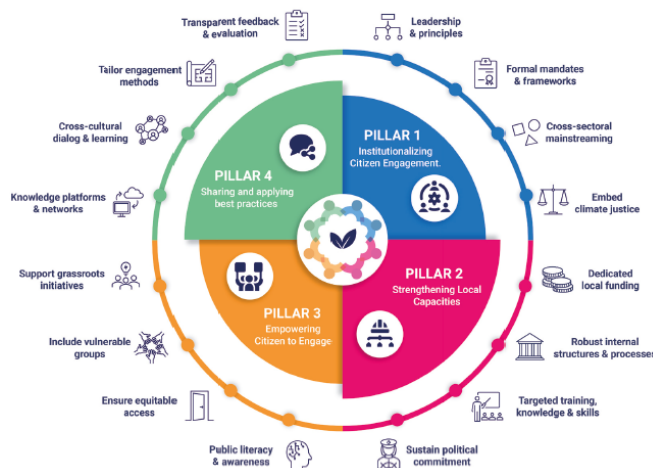


Figure 15. Policy white paper graphical summary.

The KPIs determined for activities related to communication as well as dissemination of Adaptation AGORA’s activities varied from number of participants in diverse events to downloads of the Mobile App. The objectives determined in the GA are expected to be achieved in different phases, some of which were defined after the project was completed considering specific tasks were expected to be finished first. This is the case for instance of the Digital Handbook, which was initially scheduled to be released in M36, was anticipated to M34 to ensure it could be included in the project’s presentations, workshops and other related activities during M35 and M36, taking advantage of high-exposure opportunities such as COP30.

Given the positive impact the project was having with its stakeholders, during the beginning of 2025 adjustments were made to the tasks scheduled in order to maximize the opportunities for communication while the project was still alive. This strategic decision from WP7 contributed to ensuring the majority of the KPIs were already accomplished by the end of the project at M36.

Table 9 summarizes the C&D KPIs as established, the Mobile App is the only one which has not yet achieved the target number of downloads and the task leader together with WP2’s leader (where the task was developed) has established a dissemination plan aligned with the exploitation of this



result in new projects they will be carrying out starting in 2026. More details are outlined in D6.5 which constitutes the Exploitation Strategy of Adaptation AGORA.

As it can be evidenced, the majority of the KPIs were accomplished during the project's execution, including for instance the total number of downloads and views of the Digital Handbook, which originally was set to be achieved after the lifecycle of the project had been completed. At M36, the Adaptation AGORA project management team gathered key partners to establish a supporting strategy aligned with projects that will be exploiting the results from the project to ensure the two KPIs related to the Mobile App and the ACH will be achieved in the timeframe established in the GA. More details are outlined in the Exploitation Strategy and in the summary included in the next section.

7. Exploitation strategy in brief

The Adaptation AGORA exploitation strategy (WP6/D6.5) ensures long-term impact through a dual approach: Ex Ante Exploitation continuously refines results during the project lifetime, while Ex Post Exploitation focuses on the active promotion, transfer, and scaling of the twelve KERs after project completion.

Long-term digital sustainability is secured by hosting the ACH as a permanent microsite on weADAPT, alongside the continued accessibility of the Digital Academies and the Gamified Mobile App for youth outreach. Exploitation is actively driven by consortium communication and high-impact international events. Partner activities, such as press releases, articles, and interviews, translate complex findings like the policy roadmap into actionable public discourse, directly supporting the replication and policy integration of the project's methodology and digital tools.

High-level event participation, such as presenting at the Living Planet Symposium 2025 (ESA) to ensure integration with the Earth Observation community and contributing to Adaptation Futures 2025 and COP30, maximizes the formal uptake of policy findings in global negotiations. This strategic outreach directly serves three core transformational pillars: policy integration and institutionalization, pan-European replication and tool transfer, and long-term digital sustainability and legacy via platforms like weADAPT, Dataclime, Horizon Results Platform, and thanks to the support of Horizon Europe projects like [REINFORCING](#), that will showcase Adaptation AGORA results on a dedicated platform (“Open and Responsible Research and Innovation Platform”).

The true measure of successful exploitation is the project's ability to gain traction and validation from external stakeholders. The evidence below provides concrete examples of this success, showcasing organic communication activities, such as independent articles (by Climate ADAPT) and media promotion (interview to the Coordinator Paola Mercogliano, on [Linea Verde](#), a RaiPlay show broadcasted on National Italian TV), conducted/led by non-consortium entities. This third-party endorsement is vital for enhancing the project's credibility, extending its reach beyond the partner network, and accelerating the adoption of its KERs by policymakers and practitioners across Europe.

8. Conclusion

The communication and dissemination activities of Adaptation AGORA have been highly effective, successfully establishing the project as a central actor in the European climate adaptation ecosystem. The comprehensive strategy, built on robust quantitative and qualitative efforts, not only met but substantially surpassed the KPI targets established in the GA. This quantitative success was marked by both the website visits (exceeding 10,000 visits) and social media engagement (exceeding 1,000 followers) being greatly surpassed.

This achievement was strategically driven by a significant boost in content volume, which in some instances resulted in the project nearly doubling the GA's monthly target of 20 social media posts. Furthermore, the website demonstrated extraordinary global reach, drawing substantial traffic from far beyond the core EU community, which confirmed the international relevance of Adaptation AGORA's innovative solutions. The project demonstrated strategic flexibility by optimizing for maximum inclusion and impact. Instead of hosting a single large Final Event (intended for over 100 people), the project strategically pivoted to numerous smaller, well-spread events, workshops, and high-level presentations across the EU.

This maximized geographical reach and ensured results were disseminated directly and tailored within diverse local contexts. Furthermore, the communication strategy prioritized language inclusion, utilizing five different languages and consistently producing materials in English and the local language for the Pilot regions. This qualitative focus, alongside the implementation of the Google Translate plugin on the website, guaranteed wider participation and reduced accessibility barriers. In addition to the pilot regions in situ activities, the project also successfully organized dedicated peer-learning workshops and thematic webinars, serving as critical platforms for co-creation and bridging the science-practice gap by promoting mutual learning and effective networking with numerous influential external projects and initiatives.

The final phase of the project established clear mechanisms for sustained legacy and knowledge uptake. One example is the "Voices of Climate Adaptation" Digital Handbook that serves as the project's main repository, enduring dissemination asset. This interactive, multimedia platform successfully integrates and contextualizes all key results, offering a user-friendly archive for the project's lessons learned and replicable methodologies. Critically, the Consortium has formalized its commitment to post-project dissemination.

This commitment is confirmed by planned actions, such as the presentation planned at the Stockholm Smart City Expo in May 2026, ensuring the continued visibility and relevance of Adaptation AGORA's findings well beyond its termination. In conclusion, the Adaptation AGORA



communication and dissemination activities have laid a robust foundation, not only amplifying the project's visibility, but also ensuring its knowledge and innovative adaptation tools are accessible, replicable, and poised to inform future climate resilience efforts globally.
